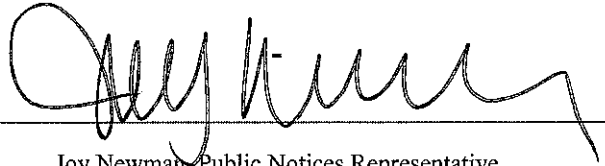

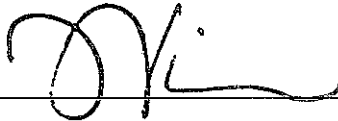

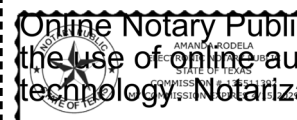

later, the Royals lost the game. Ercceg has allowed 17 hits in his last five innings. In his last four appearances, he has recorded nine outs and allowed nine runs.

It's one game. It's one pitcher. It's one perfect example of this season: The Royals have far too frequently pressed the same players into the same roles and expected them to produce different results.

Quatraro's motto of "Today" is supposed to be built for these moments — to stop the avalanche by ignoring its existence and embracing a new day. The avalanche is not only here but continues to pick up momentum.

At some point, the preference for consistency and the resolve to make decisions built on past success starts to mirror stubbornness. And a mandate to turn the page can subtract the acknowledgement, or even some of the urgency, of where exactly this team sits — which at the moment is the bottom of the baseball world.

The manager in charge of one of the best single-season turnaround in baseball history — who guided the team to back-to-back winning seasons for the first time in a decade — has not suddenly

forgotten how to do his job, nor can we suddenly forget that's part of the resume.

But it's equally worth mentioning, and even more visibly evident, that Quatraro isn't pushing the right buttons. That statement alone, however, prompts a far more important question:

Do the Royals even have the right buttons available?

Somebody has to hit third behind Bobby Witt Jr.

Somebody has to hit cleanup.

Someone has to pitch the ninth.

Someone has to pitch the eighth.

The Royals have also operated like a team without many right answers. They have scored fewer runs per game than any team in baseball. They were 26th in the league a year ago. The offense so rarely gives everyone else a night off — so rarely allows for a bullpen or starting rotation to endure even the shortest of slumps, let alone the kind of slump the Royals' bullpen has endured this year.

Since the start of the 2025 season, a span of 223 games, the Royals have put up three or more runs in an inning in just 74 games, six fewer than any

other team in the American League. Those are essentially game-changing innings, though that's what the Royals have almost shown an immunity toward: Change.

The noise growing outside the Royals' walls isn't just about the results. It's about the consistency, even predictability, with which they arrive.

The lineup absorbed only tweaks, not overhauls, in the offseason after finishing 26th in runs. Club brass was banking on internal improvement but underplaying the possibility for internal regression. As an asterisk, I'll point out the outfielder names being thrown around over the past couple of winters have flopped, but the Royals have failed to acquire a middle-of-the-order bat that could ease stress on the entire operation.

They had only four regulars record an OPS (on-base plus slugging percentage) better than .700 a year ago — Bobby Witt Jr., Maikel Garcia, Vinnie Pasquantino and Salvador Perez. All four have a worse OPS this season — by an average of 99 points per player.

Until very recently, when Quatraro has tinkered with the order, those four continued to occupy the top four spots in the lineup. Pasquantino and Perez are top-five in the AL in plate appearances

with runners in scoring position this season — which should come as no surprise for players who bat directly behind Bobby Witt Jr. — yet they are two of the three least productive hitters in the AL, with runners in scoring position this year.

Those situations — runners in scoring position — ballooned the Royals' team totals in 2024. But that has proven to be an aberration. They've not only regressed to the mean but blown far below it.

Which reflects where they are.

Their lineup has grown worse and less productive, despite only one player aging beyond his peak. NCAA BASEBALL TOURNAMENT

Reassessing who's who in wide-open super regionals

After last season saw No. 1 Vanderbilt and No. 2 Texas fail to make it out of the NCAA baseball tournament opening weekend to super regionals, one would think it would be hard to be surprised by the 2026 iteration.

One would be wrong.

The 2026 tournament is sending a couple of stunners to the next round, including two No. 4 seeds for the first time. And those No. 4 seeds aren't quirky little flukes either. They both swept their regionals, with St. John's making it out of Tallahassee undefeated and Little Rock doing the same out of Hattiesburg, a regional where the lower seed won *every single game*.

Some regionals were more chalky, but perhaps surprising in how chalky they were. Take the Chapel Hill regional, quickly coined as the regional of death, saw North Carolina cruise. Or Eugene, where Oregon fought off the zombie Pac-12 and advanced to play Texas.

But once again, the biggest stunners were at the top of the bracket. No. 1 UCLA was beaten not once, but twice, by Saint Mary's, which was beaten not once, but twice, by Cal Poly, the eventual bracket winners. The Atlanta regional took seven games to decide, with popular champion pick No. 2 Georgia Tech — a team brimming with MLB talent — falling to Oklahoma, which battled back to make it to supers for the first time since 2022.

Who are the best teams left in the field? Here's a look at the final 16 now that we have eyes on them in the tournament.

No. 1: Georgia

The highest seed left in the field, Georgia did what it was supposed to do in Athens. It throttled Long Island after an interruption from weather, and it beat a tough (and arguably under-seeded) Liberty team twice to advance. Daniel Jackson is one of the best players left in this tournament, having cranked two homers in the regional round. He'll look to lead the Bulldogs over another SEC foe in Mississippi State.

No. 2: North Carolina

When North Carolina's draw was revealed, there was a lot of hand-wringing about what looked like a regional of death. There was the big name in Tennessee, the sneaky auto-bid in East Carolina, and of course the treacherous No. 4 seed in VCU. The Tar Heels looked unfazed, dispatching VCU with ease behind normal Saturday night starter Ryan Lynch. Even with a less-than-stellar outing from Jason DeCaro against ECU, the Tar Heels rallied and won. They're going to be a tough out moving forward.

No. 3: Texas

Texas caught a huge break in the Austin regional, as it never had to face Jackson Flora with UC Santa Barbara losing its first game and putting its back against the wall. Even so, Texas absolutely ran through Austin, only really facing resistance against the Gauchos. Jim Schlossnagle's decision to make Dylan Volantis the Friday night starter has been prescient. In fact, the only really weakness the Longhorns show right now is in the depth behind him, having used 12 pitchers over the two games Volantis didn't start.

No. 4: Auburn

Somehow, Milwaukee was the terror of the Auburn regional. Until it wasn't. After dropping its first game against the

Panthers, Auburn broke its spirit in the sixth and seventh games of the regional, winning by a combined 16-4 score. The big concern for Auburn is pitching. Jake Marciano is better than his record, and Alex Petrovic has emerged as a viable No. 2. But the Tigers need consistency if they're going to beat Ole Miss.

No. 5: Oregon

Oregon looked like it had a lot of problems in its regional. The Ducks were stuck with two teams with grudges. But as it turned out, Oregon State and Washington State were trapped with Oregon. Will Sandford and Miles Gosztola were stellar for the Ducks, and Oregon allowed just three runs all regional. Oregon also has the bats to run with Texas in supers, the question is if the Ducks can continue to outduel the teams they play again.

No. 6: Alabama

We still have a lot to learn about the Crimson Tide, with Alabama getting foisted into a very favorable regional. After dominating Alabama State, SC Upstate nearly battled back from a 7-2 hole before Oklahoma State took Alabama to extras. Even so, Oklahoma State always had that potential from a No. 2 seed, and Alabama weathered that storm. It can't be docked too much for that.

No. 7: Oklahoma

OK, so now things get a little wonky. Oklahoma entered the tournament as a No. 2 seed in the Atlanta regional because of a devastating late-season slump where it went 4-9 and lost to a woeful LSU team in the SEC tournament. Well, the bats woke up in Atlanta. Oklahoma scored 38 runs over its last three games and beat a potent Georgia Tech team twice, including battling back from a 7-2 deficit in the decisive Game 7. The time to sleep on Oklahoma was last Thursday. Now it's time to take this team seriously.

No. 8: Kansas

With the way the Lawrence regional was being talked about, you'd have thought it was being played in Fayetteville. Never mind the Jayhawks won the Big 12 tournament for the first time in

20 years, or were Big 12 regular-season champs for the first time since it was the Big Eight, or were coming off a tournament appearance in 2025. Well, Kansas got slept on. And now I'm ranking it behind its super regional opponent in the re-rank. So the Jayhawks have another chance to make me look silly in the first super regional hosted at Hogle Stadium.

No. 9: Ole Miss

While North Carolina made it out of its regional of death, the same couldn't be said for Nebraska in Lincoln. The Cornhuskers didn't make their regional championship game, with Ole Miss and Arizona State predictably playing spoiler. The Rebels never played the No. 4 seed in Lincoln, defeating Arizona State twice and Nebraska once. Ole Miss pitching held out, but if anything does in the Rebels, it will be starting pitching.

No. 10: Southern Cal

A Los Angeles Big Ten team made it out of regionals, just not the No. 1 seed. The knock against USC was how terrible the Trojans were against good teams, but they beat Texas A&M twice to make it out of College Station. Jack Basee looks like a star while Augie Lopez brings some thump to the order. This is a USC team built for the tournament, with Mason Edwards and Grant Govel providing one of the country's tougher Friday-Saturday starting duos. The only reason they aren't ranked higher is because it takes more than one weekend to beat a 1-11 record against Quad 1.

No. 11: Cal Poly

This might get me yelled at, and I might deserve it. How do you sweep the No. 1 bracket and end up at No. 11? Cal Poly ran roughshod over the Los Angeles regional, and catcher Ryan Tayman was outstanding. Ultimately, the transitive property doesn't apply in baseball, and Cal Poly didn't beat UCLA twice. But it does have a real chance in its super regional showdown in ...

No. 12: West Virginia

... Morgantown! West Virginia scraped through its regional by the skin of its teeth, and now it gets to host again

as a 16-seed. The Mountaineers pulled off a miraculous comeback against Kentucky in Game 6 before walking off the Wildcats in extra innings in Game 7. Whether facing Cal Poly is a boon or not remains to be seen, but West Virginia is dancing onward.

No. 13: Mississippi State

Mississippi State did its job in a favorable Starkville regional, cruising through Lipscomb, Cincinnati, and Louisiana. It will now see Georgia, a team it has yet to beat this season. The MSU Bulldogs got good innings out of Tomas Valincius and Ryan McPherson that allowed their order to thump in regionals. But they need even more out of their pitching staff to stave off arguably the best team left in the field.

No. 14: Little Rock

Hattiesburg was, legitimately, an insane regional. The higher seed didn't win a single game, and as such, No. 4 Little Rock was able to sweep through. It beat Jacksonville State, a team many thought could have been a No. 2 seed, twice, with the bullpen doing serious heavy lifting throughout. Little Rock faces another Sun Belt team in super regionals now, a team no one expected to host.

No. 15: Troy

The third and final Trojans team in the field, Troy crushed Florida not once, but twice to get here. The Trojans, who lost 29 games this year and still got in as an at-large thanks to a brutal nonconference schedule, were built for post-season play. Troy capitalized on an exhausted Florida team to steal the Gainesville regional. Now either it or Little Rock will be making their first CWS appearance.

No. 16: St. John's

He brings needed creativity to help find Haaland in the right places. Defense is where Norway could be susceptible to attacks coming from France and Senegal. Senegal: Mane, who had a remarkable Liverpool career before moving to Saudi Arabia, is the biggest name of the group. This year, Algeria can draw some inspiration from Morocco, which in 2022 became the first African nation to reach the semifinal of a World Cup. Argentina: The reigning World Cup champions will enter the 2026 tournament on the short list of favorites. It will mark Lionel Messi's record-tying sixth and — likely — final World Cup, as the competition will serve as a sort of "last dance" for the soccer GOAT. Argentina could make history if it can repeat — only Brazil (1958 and 1962) and Italy (1934 and 1938) have won back-to-back World Cups. Key players: Emiliano Martinez, Lautaro Martinez, Lionel Messi

Austria: Austria is back in the World Cup for the first time in 28 years and will not be satisfied with just being there. Under renowned coach Ralf Rangnick — who is known for his gegenpressing style of play — Austria won six of its eight World Cup qualifiers to reach the 2026 tournament. That performance came after Austria won its group at Euro 2024 — ahead of France and the Nether-

lands. Austria will be a worthy challenger for Argentina in Group J. Key players: David Alaba, Marko Arnautovic, Marcel Sabitzer

Jordan: Jordan is one of four nations that will compete in the World Cup for the first time — Cape Verde, Curaçao and Uzbekistan are the others taking advantage of the tournament's expanded 48-team field. DR Congo: Making just its second World Cup appearance and first since 1974, DR Congo blends key players at top clubs and others further down the ladder. The Leopards need Newcastle forward Yoane Wissa to find his scoring form after a disappointing first season following a move from Brentford. The midfield will lean on Noah Sadiki, who was a centerpiece for Sunderland in helping the club reach Europa League qualification. The defense is anchored by captain Chancel Mbemba. Solidity at the back will be crucial against the offenses of Colombia and Portugal if DR Congo is to advance. Key players: Yoane Wissa, Chancel Mbemba, Noah Sadiki

Uzbekistan: The rise of the White

Wolves has slowly been coming with regular participation in youth World Cups and the Olympics that has built a foundation of young talent that blossomed with the country's first qualification. The gem is Abdulkodir Khusanov, a physical and ridiculously fast defender who has shined for Manchester City this season and is only 22 years old. Up front, captain Eldor Shomurodov led the Super Lig in Turkey with 22 goals for Istanbul Basaksehir. The strategy for advancement will be relying on a defense that allowed just seven goals in 10 World Cup qualifiers and being opportunistic when scoring chances come. Key players: Abdulkodir Khusanov, Abbosbek Fayzullaev, Eldor Shomurodov

Group L

Croatia: Croatia doesn't get mentioned enough in "World Cup favorites" conversations, but the squad with the iconic checkerboard jerseys is a force to be reckoned with on the international stage. Croatia was World Cup runner-up in 2018 and finished third in Qatar in 2022. In addition, Croatia was a finalist in the 2023 UEFA Nations League competition. Winning a trophy has been elusive, but it's a safe bet Croatia will be a thorn in the side of Group L favorite England, and then a tough out in the knockout stages. Key players: Josko Gvardiol, Mateo Kovacic, Luka Modric

England: Will fans of the Three Lions be singing "Football's coming home" all the way to the final on July 19? Playing in the U.S. will be a near home-field experience for England, which has a strong fan following in America. Can the team parlay that support — coupled with a talented squad — into finally getting over the top? It's been 60 years since England's lone World Cup triumph, and anything short of a title this summer will be considered a disappointment. Key players: Jude Bellingham, Harry Kane, Bukayo Saka

Ghana: Ghana has been a regular at the World Cup, having qualified for five of the last six tournaments after first playing in the World Cup in 2006. Despite being one of Africa's most consistent squads on the international stage, Ghana opted for chaos before the 2026 World Cup. The team sacked coach Otto Addo just 78 days before the start of the World Cup, replacing him with Carlos Queiroz in a hire announced on April 13. Key players: Mohammed Kudus, Antoine Semenyo, Iñaki Williams

Panama: Panama is making just its second World Cup appearance after finishing in 32nd place (out of 32 teams) at the 2018 World Cup in Russia. Los Canales face a tough task in Group L but enter the World Cup after going unbeaten in Concacaf qualifying. Key players: Adalberto "Coco" Carrasquilla, Ismael Diaz, Anibal Godoy

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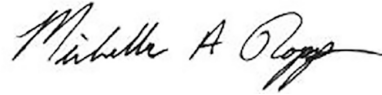
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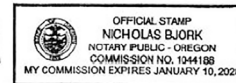
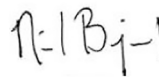
